I recently attended the funeral of a friend's father who died very unexpectedly. I was struck by how joyful people seemed be despite their sudden loss. Indeed, the funeral was a celebration of this man's life and the Christian legacy he left behind. The reception following seemed more like a wedding reception than a wake.

We are just on the heels of Easter...the greatest day in our Church's liturgical year. Resurrection Day. This is the day when we celebrate God's greatest April Fools Joke ever. While Satan thought he had conquered Jesus, God's one and only Son, through his dying on the cross, Jesus had the final laugh over Satan by rising again from the dead. And for those of us who believe in Jesus Christ, we have that same hope for ourselves one day.

This is Good News. This is news that changes a funeral into a celebration of life and a wake into a joyful reception. This is news that turns even our most depressing days into ones filled with Jesus' glorious light.

Upon the death of his good friend Lazarus, Jesus told Lazarus' sisters, "I am the resurrection and life. Whoever believes in me will live, even though they die; and whoever lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?" John 11:25-26

But do we believe this in the depths of our hearts? If so, then do we live it?

If we do, then I believe that we would live differently as God's beloved children. Since we'd have no fear of death, I believe that we would live with greater joy and peace, trusting that God would be with us wherever we go. I believe we take more risks for Jesus' sake. I believe we would even share our faith with more confidence trusting that God would cause the seeds we sow to grow.

My hope in this post Easter season is that we would live as people who truly trust in Jesus' words. Whatever happens, may we always be filled with the joyful hope of living as Resurrection people every day because, whether in life or in death, we belong to the Lord!

SPOTLIGHT ON OUR MEMBERS

Born in Ballerup, Denmark, she had a very secure, happy, and innocent childhood post-World War II. Ballerup, today part of greater Copenhagen, was a lovely little old town back then where everyone knew each other, a very nice environment in which to be raised, providing her and two older siblings with happy childhood memories.

In Hanne Karman's words: "Parkskolen was my grammar and middle school only a fiveminute walk from my house. I liked going to school. Later schools were always reached by bicycle. All through grammar school, I had the same wonderful teacher, Miss Gudrun Larsen, for all subjects. She was such a wonderful, caring, and capable teacher. Later, when I returned to Denmark for visits, I never failed to visit with my old teacher until her death. In middle school I had more demanding subjects. I loved learning languages and excelled both in English and in German.



"In 1958 I applied for an American Field Service scholarship. I was a very lucky girl to be granted this, so I lived with a wonderful family In San Jose, California for one year and attended San Jose High School. Upon graduating, my year was over, and I returned to Denmark to finish up my schooling there.

"In 1961, I met up in London with a young man I had met in California where he had finished his degree in electrical engineering at Stanford University on a ROTC scholarship. He had been commissioned to the Navy's Civil Engineer Corps, Bureau of Yards and Docks, in London. I started and completed my nursing degree at Fulham Hospital in London. In 1963, we were married and, in 1965, returned to the States. In 1966 our first son, Peter, was born. In 1968, a devastating tragedy happened, as my husband, Bruce, had a reaction to anesthesia while undergoing surgery and died. I was pregnant with our second son at the time. My nursing career became my lifeline.

"10 years went by. In Westminster Presbyterian Church, West Chester, PA, I was blessed to meet Lou Karman, a widower with three grown children. We married in 1978 and spent 41 wonderful years till his death in 2019. At this point I decided to move west to be closer to family. With God's grace, I feel I have been blessed throughout my life! My two sons and their families with grandchildren Cassie, Haley, Sidney, Cade and Bridget are such blessings!

"I'm very happy I found Cascades Presbyterian Church. I felt so welcome from the first day. The congregation is so friendly and inclusive. The world is indeed small as Pastor Chris and our family lived in the same area in Pennsylvania, and also Pastor Chris and my son Peter shared similar experiences in the Navy.

"It is and has been a great privilege and blessing being an American Dane through this wondrous journey called life!"
