One of Cascades' core values that we strive towards is... "We know, appreciate, and love one another, sharing lives of faith." This has always been important to our congregation ever since Cascades was founded back in 1979. But getting to know one another in greater depth is not always easy or possible during the fellowship hour immediately following Sunday worship. Usually that time is spent on small talk, simply catching up on what took place that week. It's actually when we intentionally spend time together outside of Sunday morning that we learn more about someone's life, both good and bad.

This is also why we do The Member in the Spotlight Summer Sermon Series and we feature member's stories each month in the Bell Newsletter. Recently we heard from Mary Beth Northrup in worship and this month you'll read about recently graduated senior Seth Hartrim-Lowe.

But there is another reason why getting to know one another is so important. It's part of our discipleship as followers of Jesus Christ. The scripture above from 1 Peter 3:15 commands us to always be ready to give an answer for the hope that is within us. This requires us to take time to reflect over our lives, consider the difference that knowing Jesus Christ has made, and then be ready to share the hope that we've found. We also can think through questions like... What's been good? What's been hard? When did we experience God most? Or where was God seemingly absent? And what have we learned about Jesus along the way?

So how can we create more space for us to spend time together outside of Sunday morning with one another? We can come to the All Church Picnic at the Hartrim-Lowe Farm after worship on July 20. We can participate in the Cascades Bowling Fellowship. We can share our crafts and talents at the Giving Hands Ministry Workshop on Thursday afternoons. We can participate in the Youth Group on Wednesday evenings. We can actively attend Sunday school in the Fall. We can come to the once monthly Saturday morning Men's Fellowship and Bible Study (on break for the summer). We can be involved with the Women's Fellowship starting in September. We can ask someone to serve with us at one of Cascades Ministry Partners like Friends of the Carpenter, Heritage Farm, FISH of Orchards, Open House Ministries, or Family Promise of Clark County. We can invite a friend out to eat or over for a meal after church on Sunday. Or we can ask someone out for coffee as a chance to get to know them. The options are endless, but it requires some planning and creativity on our parts.

So lets' not wait for someone else to create the program to make this happen or for the invitation to go out. Initiate it. Be intentional. And then see how God begins to knit our hearts together as we share lives of faith.

SPOTLIGHT ON OUR MEMBERS



Seth Hartrim-Lowe was previously featured in the August 2021 edition of The Bell. Kim Foster wrote that Seth, then 14 years old, had already experienced a lot in his life. We learned he was born near Austin, TX, moved three times by the age of 2, when his dad settled the family in New Mexico.

10 years ago, the Hartrim-Lowes moved to the Vancouver area and began attending Cascades Church. Seth, home-schooled, and one of seven children in the family, helped clean house and assisted in feeding the chickens, dogs, cats, goats, cows and alpacas, which naturally led to his involvement with 4-H, joining their Legos robotics club along with his brothers, Sam and Harrison. Meeting in the same place (a local church) was the high school-aged robotics club, which eventually moved to Prairie High School. There, in January 2023, Seth joined that group, called the Cloverbots, worked through the post-Covid doldrums and, through his extra effort, put in the hours to elevate the group to where it is now. Eight adult mentors, all STEM oriented, help the students in their efforts.

Specializing in electrical and software functions, he was responsible for 95% of the coding! This year, realizing it was his final year of high school, Seth decided to leave well-documented material for the club, so he re-wrote the robot code base so future students will have good access to it all.

When asked about the Cloverbots' competition in Houston this year, Seth replied, "It was a fantastic opportunity to see fellow STEM students from across the world. We were able to compete against the best of the world, including a match against a team that is a five-time world champion (it was especially exciting to win that match). Our team placed 8th on our field of 75, an incredible accomplishment for our small team. We also received the Rising All-Star Award, which acknowledges a team that has undergone difficulties in recent years."

In addition, Seth still participates in 4-H alpaca and poultry clubs (catch him at the Clark Country Fair this August), as well as playing oboe for Prairie High School and the Junior Symphony of Vancouver.

His family, his church family, and his robotic mentors have greatly influenced him, and now he finds his sibling relationships changing: "We've all grown up and are each going down our own path. I have weekly calls with each of my sisters while they're away. I love hanging out with my brothers throughout the week, although relationships have gone from playmates to roommates. (Twin brother) Sam and I have definitely started going down different life paths, but I am excited to see what God has planned for us both."

This fall Seth will attend California Polytechnic State University in San Luis Obispo, CA, majoring in computer science and looking forward to employment with a major West Coast tech company in the future.

He asks for our prayers for his future: "Whether it's just a few months or a few years, my future is something that is daunting to me. I'm thankful to have so many life coaches in my life that have guided me to where I am, but the unknown is always scary."

GO FOR GOLD



Congratulations to Cascades' Jasper Sutten and teammate Atticus Braam of the Vancouver Lake Rowing Club for winning First Place Gold in the Open Gender Youth Double Scull Race at the 2025 USRowing Youth National Championships. A total of 43 national champions were crowned on July 15, 2025 at the regatta held at Nathan Benderson Park in Sarasota, Florida. With 886 entries from 231 clubs and over 4,000 athletes in attendance, this year's regatta marked the largest youth championship in event history and one of the most competitive. Semifinals and finals across multiple events came down to photo finishes, highlighting the depth and speed of junior rowing in the U.S.

As the 2025 USRowing Youth National Championships ended, the event once again high-lighted the incredible talent, dedication, and sportsmanship of the next generation of rowers. From nail-biting photo finishes to commanding wire-to-wire victories, the regatta celebrated the depth and diversity of youth rowing across the country. With record-breaking participation and unforgettable racing, this year's championship set a new standard for what's possible in junior rowing.

JUNE SESSION NOTES

Devotion was on All You Need is a Commitment to Go based on Hebrews 10:24-25. Brainstormed ideas on how to cultivate new leaders and how challenging it is post COVID to get volunteers. Focused on the importance of praying for workers for God's harvest field. Received update on Kitchen remodeling project. Researching local contractors and architects to do the work. Talked about upcoming Craft and Plant Sale. Set ordination of new church officers on July 13, 2025 during worship. Overall, reflected on how we are never too old or too young to serve. God has purpose for us now. Though we may not know where or what that is, we are to serve where we can trust that God will make our callings clear over time.

SNACK PACK THANK YOU

Thanks to everyone who helped assemble Snack Packs for Friends of the Carpenter on July 1. We delivered 40 Packs the following day and significantly helped replenish their supplies. I have been present when people received the snacks and seen the pleasure they bring. Going forward, Friends of the Carpenter has refined the way they manage Snack Packs. Instead of handing out premade Packs, they are handing out a list of the seven items that we put into Packs and let the guests at the center chose four of the items. They then assemble the choices into a tailormade pack that meets the guest's preferences. It's a way to increase the autonomy of the guests and let them get the things they like the most. In the future, we will deliver boxes of items (chips, cookies, mini-muffins, apple sauce, etc.) that are most in demand so the supplies are always available. We will ask for donations when we get ready to make our next delivery, probably in July. Anyone who would like to help make a delivery and participate for an hour or so in the work that goes on at the center should talk with me. Lindsay Winsor

GEORDIE IN KENYA

Our mission partner with Imago Christi, Geordie Ziegler, is in Embu, Kenya at the foot of Mt. Etna, about 2.5 hours NE of Nairobi. He is there for about a month teaching at the Angaza Torchbearer Bible School in Africa. Angaza is an integrated school of 55 students where 1/2 come from Africa while the other 1/2 come from North America and Europe. In addition to teaching at the school, he also led an all-day marriage retreat to bless local pastors and their spouses who receive very little training of any kind to do the work of ministry. And finally on June 22, he had the chance to preach at one of the local churches.

It is such a joy to hear from Geordie and be part of his mission team as he takes the gospel to the ends of the earth. Cascades provides monthly support to Geordie and Sharon Ziegler so that they can provide the kinds of support to local pastors and ministry leaders so that they stay spiritually healthy as they minister to others.


