Ever since 1983, Cascades' kitchen has been the heart of the church and has served our congregation well through many potlucks, weddings and funerals, pancake breakfasts, and other fellowship events. Now 42 years old, it has been obvious that it needs to be updated and expanded. A group of folks have been meeting to discuss current needs and wants, researching contractors, and developing conceptual plans to expand and remodel the current kitchen. On October 5, 2025 following worship, the Cascades session has called a special meeting of the congregation to discuss the project and receive approval to begin raising funds. We anticipate that a complete remodel and expansion would cost approximately \$100,000 to \$150,000. Stay tuned for more information in the September Newsletter. But mark your calendars for that October 5 Special Congregational meeting.


