Saul, who later became the Apostle Paul, had a radical encounter with the living Christ. One day on his way to persecute members of The Way (early Christians), he was literally knocked on his behind when Jesus stopped him from going any further and asked him why he was doing what he was doing. That encounter changed his life and gave him his calling to spread the Good News of Jesus Christ throughout the known Gentile world.

Imagine if we each came to our own times of study in God's Word expecting to have a personal encounter with living Jesus Christ! Imagine how radical and exciting each day would become!

Throughout our fall sermon series, How to Hear God, based on Pete Greig's book with the same title, we hear story after story of people in the bible and people we know who have had these sorts of encounters with the living Jesus Christ. Sometimes God speaks to us through prayer, through God's prophets, through others, through our circumstances, and through our culture. But we know that God always speaks to us through His Word. Oftentimes the reason we don't hear God is that our lives are just too busy and hurried to take time to listen to the still small voice as God speaks.

I know that is true in my own life. I can get so busy doing even good things in the church, in my neighborhood, in my family, and in my own life that there is little time where I can set aside for quiet where God often speaks. That's why I am intentional about retreating to quiet places at least once a month where I can be present with the Lord as the Lord is present with me. And in that stillness, God speaks.

But sometimes when God speaks it can be downright confusing or difficult to understand exactly what God is trying to say to us. That is why it is important to be part of a smaller group of faithful Christian people where we can discern whether or not we are actually hearing God's voice.

Samuel was a small boy who had been dedicated by his mother to serve in the temple. One night Samuel woke up hearing someone call his name, but he didn't know who it was. He kept going to Eli the temple priest to see if it was he who kept calling him. But it was not. Finally, after the last time, Eli told Samuel that it was the Lord who was calling him and that he was to answer, "Here I am, Lord! Your servant is listening." Eli was right and Samuel heard God's voice. In this story, Eli played that crucial role of a faith community that helped Samuel discern that it was actually God. Samuel could not do it by himself but needed Eli's help.

In the same way, we need the help of one another to help discern God's voice in our own lives. Thank God that we have this place called Cascades Presbyterian Church where we can be surrounded by other faithful Christ followers who have also heard God's voice for themselves and can help us as well! If you are not part of such a smaller group, I cannot encourage you enough to consider joining either the Fall Women's Bible Study or the Men's Once Saturday Fellowship Breakfast and Bible Study. These are great places to be connected with people who will help us hear the voice of God.

UPDATE ON THE SCHOOL PERMITTING PROCESS

When we undertook the project with the Clark County Development Office to be re-permitted to host a preschool/ kindergarten in our existing facility, we knew that it would be a difficult and slow journey. What we did not expect was that it would be so expensive. After submitting documents for the pre-application conference which told us exactly what we would need to do and how much it would cost for us to do it, we were informed by Clark County that we would have to pay over \$66,000 in traffic impact fees. This is due to the supposed number of additional daily trips that a preschool of our size (40 students) would allegedly generate. These fees also do not include the nearly \$16,000 in permit review fees nor changes what would be required for our facility to meet current school codes. Needless to say, we do not feel that these expenses are fair and have petitioned our Clark County Commissioners to have such fees waived. So as of right now, it seems that the Lord is not giving us the green light to move forward on the project as we had hoped. Instead we are waiting patiently on our Commissioners responses, and if the Lord so wills, we will move forward. If not, we will not proceed further.

SANCTUARY PROJECTOR REPLACEMENT

The technology required for the Sunday morning worship service has evolved significantly from rolling out an overhead projector to display worship music to the current technology environment that supports our service today. The projectors are a main element of our worship experience providing many essential tasks: easy access to lyrics for our worship music; weekly announcements; visual aids for the sermon; minute for mission; movies for special events with the children; and displaying photographs of our community life.

Unfortunately, as you may have noticed, our projectors are getting old and have begun to display visual defects. There is a slight pink/purple hue that is present on the left side and bottom of the display from both projectors. This will continue to degrade and cannot be repaired. This means the church will need to buy new projectors. The current projectors have provided an excellent service for about 10 years. At the last bulb change several years ago, both projectors had over 5000 hours of service logged (bulbs are rated for 2500 hours).

Due to the degrading condition of our projectors and the brightness in our sanctuary during the service, the church needs to purchase projectors that can output 5000 lumens or better to display properly. The current projectors are Epson PowerLight projectors. A replacement Epson PowerLight 2250U today will cost \$1,674, for a total of \$3,348. The newer projectors have an increase in lamp life which will get 5000 hours as opposed to 2500. There are several other improvements such as an aspect ratio of 16:10 vs the current 4:3 ratio.

Projectors are an essential part of our worship service. This cost is a capital expense and outside of the usual 2024 operation and expense budget. 2024 MISSION TRIP TO HONDURAS







